FRH Torch of Heritage and Culture lit again at the European Landscape Forum on 24 February in Aschaffenburg, Germany

The FRH Torch, a memory treasure box carrying personal stories related to religious heritage, is continuing its journey around Europe. Part of the European Year of Cultural Heritage, the FRH Torch is a unique opportunity to involve people more closely with religious heritage.

ASCHAFFENBURG, DE - After its successful launch in Leeuwarden, the Netherlands, last month, the FRH Torch was hosted in Aschaffenburg, Germany, where it collected stories from six new contributors at the European Landscape Forum organised by CIVILSCAPE on 23-26 February.

On Saturday, **24 February at 9:30 am**, the FRH Torch was lit again and new contributions were added to the ever-expanding collection of memories. We are proud to announce that among the contributors were **Mr. Winfried Bausback**, State Minister of Justice of Bavaria; **Dr. Inge Gotzmann**, President of CIVILSCAPE and Director of Bund Heimat und Umwelt (BHU); **Ms. Andrea Lindholz**, Member of the German Parliament; **Dr. Martin Kares**, musicologist, consultant for musical instruments, Karlsruhe; **Dr. Gerhard Ermischer**, President of the Archäologisches Spessartprojekt (ASP); and **Mr. Dirk Gotzmann**, Director of CIVILSCAPE.
