CONTEST RULES

Deadline: 25 September

Whether you have a passion for photography or video or simply like to move around with your camera in hand, this is your chance to share your creativity with an enthusiastic community of heritage lovers and win a prize for it.

The FRH Photo & video competition 2022 will run from 23 May to 25 September. The winner of each category will be announced in the second week of October and will be invited to the FRH Biennial Conference in Lund, Sweden.

1. Important dates

Submissions: from 23 May to 25 September 2022.

Announcement of the winners: 10 October 2022 during the European Week of Regions and Cities.

Awards ceremony: 23 April 2023 in Lund, Sweden at FRH's Biennial Conference.

2. Eligibility

The competition is open to everybody. If you are under 18 years of age you can only participate in the competition if you have the authorisation of your legal guardian.

3. Categories

The three categories for both photo and video are:

- **Religious buildings:** photos and videos with a building or group of buildings as the main element. The building doesn't need to be an active place of worship. It can be any religious site from a small chapel to a larger complex, in use or abandoned, from a medieval mosque to a 20th-century modernist temple, from a famous landmark to a lesser-known site.
- **Artefacts:** photos and videos with objects related to religious heritage as the main element. A relic, a chalice, a cross, calligraphy, a mosaic, an arch, a statue, etc.
- **People and Events:** photos and videos of celebrations, special dates or other situations where people or the festivity are the protagonists.

4. Selection criteria

The jury will select the best photos and videos on the basis of content, creativity, aesthetics, and technique.

5. Format and requirements

For the photos:

- Format: JPEG or PNG
- Minimum resolution: 1,030 pixels x 700 pixels
- Landscape or portrait photo
- Make sure it is sharp and not blurred

For the videos:

- Format: MP4
- Minimum resolution: 1,080 pixels x 1,920 pixels
- Portrait video (for phones)
- Max. 30 seconds

- Both, edited and unedited videos will be accepted
- If you use music or any visual elements in your video make sure they are not copyrighted.

6. How to submit a photo or video

Photos: via the submission form on the FRH Photo & Video competition's website.

Participants will be asked to provide their name, nationality, contact details and pictures in the right format. Each participant is allowed to submit 1 picture per category (maximum 3 per person)

Videos: via the submission form on the FRH Photo & Video competition's website.

Participants will be asked to provide their name, nationality, contact details and videos in the right format. Each participant is allowed to submit 1 video per category (maximum 3 per person)

7. Selection process and announcement of the winners

A Jury composed of two members of FRH and two expert photographers will select one winner and two finalists for each of the 3 categories.

Finalists and winners will be announced during the European Week of Regions and Cities 2022 in the second week of October.

The winner and finalists will be invited to join the Award Ceremony that will take place at the FRH Biennial Conference 2023 in Lund, Sweden.

8. Prize

Winners and finalists will be invited to the FRH Biennial Conference 2023 in Lund, Sweden (20-22 April), where they will receive an award certificate, handed over by FRH's President, Pilar Bahamonde. FRH will only cover the conference participation costs of one overall winner up to a maximum of 1000€.

The winning and finalists' photos and videos will be included in a compilation book and highlighted in a special publication and FRH communications.

By participating in this contest you give your consent for FRH to use the submitted photos and videos in the network's non-for-profit communications, including the website, promotional materials, etc.
